Message from the Shire President
November 2018



The Shire received some welcomed news last week during a site visit from St John Management representatives to Kambalda, where they announced they have come up with a model that will provide the best solution with regards to the provision of a raft of medical services to the Kambalda community. This service will include a full-time doctor, provision for relieving doctors, staffing of the Kambalda Medical Centre to work with the current WACHS staff, introducing volunteer driver services and in time a range of other medical services that will be developed for the benefit of the community. As well as partnering with the mining companies in our region St John's have indicated the service will commence mid-November with a public opening day to celebrate this important occasion.

This will be the very first venture into primary health in regional WA by St John's. The Shire of Coolgardie is fortunate that when facing the situation of the withdrawal of the former medical practice in Kambalda, that St John's saw an opportunity to work with the Shire to this end. I would like to sincerely thank Bridget McKenzie, the project manager from St John's for the time and effort she has put into this project and I am sure we will enjoy a long and fruitful partnership with this venture.

At the September council meeting, a resolution was passed requesting the CEO to develop a tourism strategy for the Shire. As a result of this, the CEO has engaged our current consultant Mia Hicks to work on formulating a draft strategy to be presented at the November briefing forum for discussion with councillors, and then put out into the community for comments and submissions from the wider community members. I would encourage anyone in our community that may have suggestions for future development and growth of tourism, as well as improvement of our many historic and cultural attractions, that you contact your councillors, or alternately bring your ideas along to the community consultation sessions that will be held in the coming weeks.

Coolgardie residents will notice that there are roadworks occurring at the intersections on each end of Bayley Street once again. Unfortunately, this has arisen from part of the original work done during the project being substandard with sections of the pavement lifting following the rainfall the region experienced over the past weeks. The contractors will be working to complete this remedial work over the next two weeks.

The new residential rubbish bin service will commence in November. This is a result of the Shire of Coolgardie and the City of Kalgoorlie/Boulder going to tender jointly for waste services last year which has reduced the cost of our bin collection services to the Shire. The new service will see the introduction of brand new bins with red tops, which were purchased by the Shire and will have serial ID numbers and allocated to each property.

With the introduction of the new service residents will only be allowed to put out the number of bins they have paid for with their property rates. Should any residents require additional bins, they will have to make a request to our Shire staff at either Coolgardie or Kambalda offices. One other change will be the hours of the Friday services, with Kambalda commencing in the morning, followed by Coolgardie around midday. This is to allow for the disposal of the domestic waste from the truck at the Coolgardie tip facility. Over time these practices will result in further savings to the Shire due to efficiencies of the whole of waste, and facility services.

Meetings and forums attended this period:

- Meeting with Department of Communities (child protection), police and Coolgardie Primary School principal on September 21 regarding the behaviour of suspended and unsupervised children both at school and out in the wider community.
- Myself and CEO met with Mincor and MRWA managers in Kalgoorlie to discuss progress of the Widgiemooltha-Cave Hill Road realignment on September 24.
- CEO, Laura Dwyer and I met with Amana Living managers regarding the provision of aged care services in the Shire.
- The CEO, Laura Dwyer and I met with Mia Hicks on September 28 to discuss funding opportunities for tourism related projects.
- Attended a joint workshop with Shires of Dundas and Coolgardie at the Kambalda Recreation Centre on October 3

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to develop an Emergency Risk Management template. The workshop was conducted in conjunction with OEM and FESA representatives.

- Attended the RRG Technical meeting in Kalgoorlie on October 9, with Keith Dickerson and Peter Miller. The purpose of the meeting was the allocation of State Government funding for regional road projects next year.
- Myself, Cr Winter and VC co-ordinator Meghan Kent met with Donna Malec, Art Gold and GEMS in Coolgardie on October 10 to discuss a future arts and culture trail that is being developed for the Goldfields-Esperance region.
- Travelled to Perth to attend the WALGA State Roads and Transport Forum on October 15-16.

Hope you are all well and here we are at November 2018 already! Our Shire team has had another busy month in October.

On Wednesday, October 24, we had a meeting with Honourable Rita Saffioti MLA, Minister for Transport, in Coolgardie at the Truck Stop Site at the Minister's request. It was great to meet with her onsite and discuss possible options and designs that need to be further refined to present to the community. Following the onsite visit, the Shire met in the Coolgardie Administration Office to discuss land tenure, road transport and planning issues. The Minister was also very interested in a conversation around the State Lithium Strategy and the significance of the Shire's road network and in particular Bayley Street. Currently it is estimated in excess of 20 trucks a day transport lithium from the Mt Marion Mine to Kwinana.

Later that evening we attended a community information session at the Coolgardie Community Recreation Centre with the team from Northern Star Resources and Rangecon Construction. They delivered a presentation and an open question and answer time for the attendees regarding the new 289-room Ford-Bayley Workers Accommodation Village currently being constructed in Coolgardie. The Shire and Councillors are excited about the opportunities and community benefits that this project will bring to the Coolgardie Shire.

Last weekend Kambalda Community Recreation Facility hosted the CME Mines Rescue dinner that catered for approximately 300 people on Friday night, and 400 people on Sunday night for the gala dinner. It was great to catch up with the attendees especially after their intensive training and competition. Well done to the organisers, it was a great weekend and the attendees enjoyed the Kambalda hospitality.

On Wednesday, October 3, we hosted and attended a hazard scenario workshop run in conjunction with the Shire of Dundas and the State Emergency Management Committee. All of the rescue services attended and we planned and covered strategies focusing on our hazard situations should it occur in our shire. These workshops are very important and we need to be prepared for all hazard scenarios in both of our communities. Thank you to everyone who came along that day from Coolgardie and Kambalda.

Amana Living Kalgoorlie delivered a community information session and lunch at both Coolgardie and Kambalda to discuss the services they can offer to our two communities. The Shire is exploring the possibility to partner with Amana Living to deliver more services to the Shire of Coolgardie.

The Shire is extremely excited about current grant funding opportunities that are being explored. These grant funds, if successful in obtaining, will assist in the funding of the Kambalda Swimming Pool and the Post Office Building in Coolgardie.

Media release: Temporary fuel supply - 8 Granby Road, Kambalda

Coolgardie Shire President Malcom Cullen is pleased to announce that the Shire has successfully negotiated an interim solution for the supply of diesel fuel at a site in Kambalda with local business owner Joe Little at his property at Little Industries in Granby Road, Kambalda in conjunction with Eagle Petroleum.

The temporary arrangements commence on Monday 17 September 2018 and will have effect until 31 March 2019. Diesel Fuel will be available to the public 24/7 by use of credit card, Eagle Fuel card or Debit card. In addition, emergency limited supply of petrol is available in 20 litre containers on request by contacting Clint Walding directly on 0448 548 853 or by email at operations@littleindustries.com.

The fuel arrangements are:

- Diesel fuel available 24/7 by use of credit card, Eagle Fuel card or Debit Card
- Vehicles – light and heavy vehicle up to a max of 20 metres (RAV 1 network) are able to refuel at the site.
- Access to the site is via Granby Road. Follow the directional and site signage
- Once at the site there is a dedicated one-way driveway through the site. Please follow the directional signage

Building work under way on 289 room worker's accommodation village

Northern Star Resources Limited, a progressive global scale Australian gold producer, in partnership with the Shire of Coolgardie and Rangecon Construction, met with community members to discuss development on the 289-room worker's accommodation village on the evening of Tuesday, October 23.

Approximately 30 community members attended the meeting, with Northern Star general manager of operations Darren Stralow asking community members how they can work together to create shared value for Coolgardie.

"It is not in Northern Star's or the employee's interest to fly people from Perth, house them in a motel and have them drive long distances to site. What we will be offering here is a more attractive option for people who would not normally come to Coolgardie," Mr Stralow said.

Northern Star's current goldfields workforce totals more than 1000 people, with 85 per cent of those based residentially in Kalgoorlie.

Shire of Coolgardie president Malcolm Cullen said the development presents an opportunity for economic and social growth in the town.

"There are opportunities for our community to engage with Northern Star and Rangecon. The village will not have a wet mess, gym or pool. They will be using local facilities and are committed to working with our community for the benefit of all parties.

"Lease agreements signed between the Shire of Coolgardie and Northern Star have been conditional on Northern Star demonstrating to the State Government what benefits the accommodation site will provide to the community.

"The importance of this opportunity to lease the premises cannot be understated, in providing a unique opportunity

to enhance the social, community and economic sustainability of Coolgardie."

"The development of worker accommodation within the townsite will be a catalyst for positive benefits to the community and economy, that will enhance the social and lifestyle choices for those residing and working in Coolgardie," Mr Cullen said.

Brendon Grylls of Brendon Grylls Group, who is advising Northern Star on the camp development, said this was a unique opportunity between a mining company and a shire council.

"It is unusual to have a proactive mining company like Northern Star combined with a proactive council like the Shire of Coolgardie. It sends a message to other proponents that Coolgardie is open for business," Mr Grylls said.

"The use of existing infrastructure provides an economic driver for the community. The strength of small communities make big communities better and will attract more investment and attention to Coolgardie."

It is expected that the Ford-Bayley Worker's Accommodation Village, named after Arthur Bayley and William Ford who first discovered gold at Fly Flat in 1892, will be semi-operational in December 2018 with construction works completed in February 2019.

Simple steps to increase Indue card spending limit



When it comes to paying rates, the Cashless Debit Card team would like to remind participants that their Indue card has a \$1000 daily spending limit when using the card at an EFTPOS machine. When using the Indue card to pay for rates in full (if over \$1000), at the recreation centre EFTPOS machine, the daily spending limit will need to be raised.

This limit can simply be increased through the Indue web portal (online account). Alternatively, give the friendly Cashless Debit Card Hotline team a call on 1800 252 604.

Online payments and transfers (such as payments using BPAY, direct debits, card numbers) have a maximum spending limit of \$10,000. This can also be adjusted to suit the participant's preference.

■ The Coolgardie Cashless Debit Card Shopfront is open at the Coolgardie Recreation Centre from 9am–2.30pm Monday to Friday.

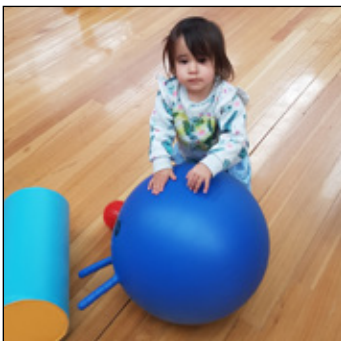


KINDY GYM

5KM SPRING FUN RUN/ WALK

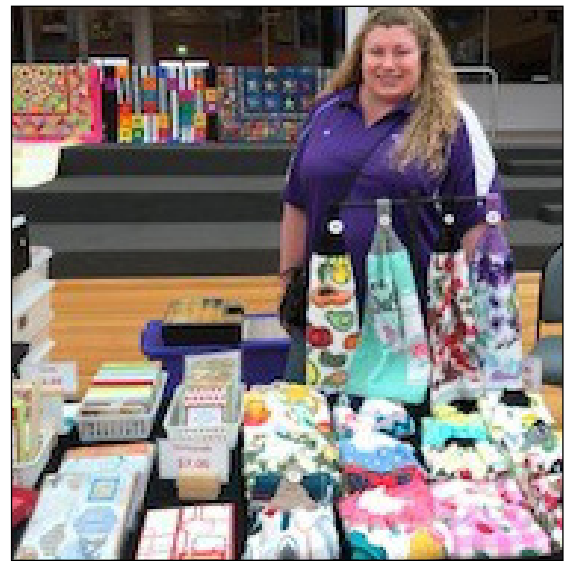
What a great month October has been. During the month we had our 5km Spring Fun Run/Walk from Kambalda East to Kambalda West.

Our very own Bernadette put on two demonstrations of her Metafit class, which is a high intensity interval workout. It was certainly a hit on the day for the younger attendees!

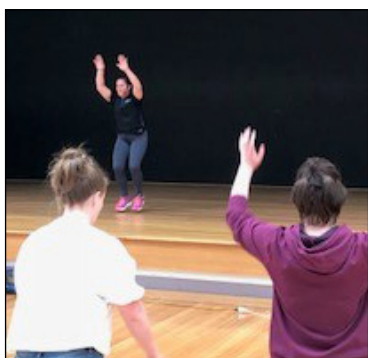

State thanks Cr Logan for decades of service to the law

Councillor Betty Logan has notched up many years of service to the community in a variety of roles, and this year one aspect of this - her work as a justice of the peace - was formally recognised by the West Australian government.

To acknowledge and express gratitude for her efforts, the government awarded her a medal commemorating more than 25 years of service as a volunteer.

Cr Logan, who was living with her young family in Norseman and working as a community health nurse at the time, became a JP in 1980 after being approached by community leaders asking her to take on the role.

She says she was initially somewhat taken aback, as JPs were generally older members of the community. However she accepted the invitation and became one of the younger JPs to be appointed.

"There was always a community project on that we were involved in, so it was good to also be able to help out as a JP and help the people," she said.

"As a JP I had the best teachers, especially Virge Wintle (deceased) who was a long-serving shire president, and in Mr Norm Morton (deceased) and Bill Hatto (deceased). They really were the best and I learned so much from them."

Cr Logan says her mentors and teachers demonstrated that while being a JP was a serious position, it was balanced out by opportunities to relax and socialise.

"It was great that we were able to be there for people, especially for travellers, and for my people, the Aboriginal community, to be able to help each other. We were often called out on weekends and nights, and could deal with the petty incidents in between the

magistrate's visits. I was able to help my people feel quite at ease, and we were able to help travellers keep moving, because of our location on the Eyre Highway, so they weren't stuck waiting for the magistrate's visit to have their matter to be dealt with.

"I learned a lot about dealing with the law and document management while also being able to help people of all colour and creed."

Cr Logan says one memorable and humorous case from her time at Norseman involved a group of traditional Aboriginal men who were travelling through the area on their way to the Coonana community for cultural reasons.

They were picked up out of Norseman after leaving Balladonia in a happy state and escorted to Norseman. The travellers appeared to be unable to comprehend the court matter, so Cr Logan and her colleagues chose to deal with the matter lightly.

She also remembers that shortly before being asked to train as a JP the Norseman courthouse was blown up by a disgruntled citizen - with the courthouse typewriter ending up on the roof of the post office across the street - and that she was glad there were no such dramatic incidents during her time on the bench.

Another highlight was receiving a letter of thanks from an appreciative representative of the government of the United States of America for "acting in the service of US citizens in outback Australia" after helping some Americans who were working at Norseman at the time.

"It gave me pleasure to be able to teach people how to deal with legal matters, which I still do today, in a fair and justly manner. We were advocates for people and able to help educate them about their rights," Cr Logan said.

Be snake aware in the Goldfields

As the weather starts to warm up, the snakes are starting to come out of hiding.

It is important to note that in the Goldfields there are legless lizards (that look very similar to snakes; but are non-venomous), non-venomous snakes (pythons) and venomous snakes. The way to tell the difference between these three species is the scales on their underside.

If you see a snake or suspect a snake to be nearby, DO NOT approach or kill it. Snakes are a protected species in Western Australia and killing them without reason can result in a fine.

There are qualified snake handlers in Coolgardie. Please contact the Shire of Coolgardie on 9080 2111 if you are in need of assistance with a snake. Please do not try and catch the snake yourself, as they can strike and may be venomous.

If you get bitten by a snake, immediately apply pressure to the wound and immobilise it, moving it as little as possible. Call triple zero (000) and try your best to recall what the snake looked like, to help with identification for anti-venom.



- The top photo, shows a venomous snake. Their belly scales are long and horizontal.
- The middle photo, shows a non-venomous python. Their belly scales are shorter and have smaller scales next to them.
- The bottom photo, shows a non-venomous legless lizard. Their belly scales are small and more patterned.

- King Brown snake – venomous
- Western Brown snake - venomous
- Dugite snake - venomous
- Tiger snake - venomous
- Carpet Python – non-venomous
- Stimson's Python – non-venomous
- Hooded Scaly-Foot legless lizard – non-venomous

St John Medical comes to Kambalda

St John and the Shire of Coolgardie have been working closely to finalise plans to provide a GP service in Kambalda, with St John Medical to open for business on Thursday, November 15, 2018, filling a void created in the town after the exiting of the previous GP service.

St John Health Services Director, Phil Holman, said after much community consultation, planning and financial forecasting, St John is optimistic it can implement a viable and sustainable primary health service that will benefit the community long into the future.

“We have done our due diligence to make sure we can deliver a comprehensive model of health care that will work with the community and business,” Mr Holman said.

“In fact, we can say we have listened to your needs because from day one we are offering a late night session to meet the needs of the community who return to Kambalda after 5pm from a days’ work.”

The service will run from the site previously used as a GP practice, inside the WA Country Health Services building on Gum Nut Place.

“St John has been running general practices in Perth for the last two years and have used this as the basis for the advanced model being introduced in Kambalda,” Mr Holman said.

“We have done our due diligence to make sure we can deliver a comprehensive model of health care that will work with the community and business.”

St John Medical will also utilise telemedicine with a metropolitan-based GP pool to build capacity and each of these doctors will spend time in the town getting to know the patients and Kambalda.

Shire President Malcolm Cullen said the Shire of Coolgardie was delighted when St John answered the call to investigate the feasibility of providing a doctor and other medical services to the town.

St John has a long track record in Kambalda. It has run a volunteer-led ambulance service for many decades and in the last financial year the service responded to more than 100 cases.

St John will also be supplemented by a range of additional St John volunteer services to help build a resilient community and these will be staged to complement growth in St John Medical services and to meet the community’s needs.

St John has long been associated with clinical volunteers in our country ambulance service. But the face of St John is changing and we are building a community of volunteers.

BUSH FIRES ACT NOTICE FOR OWNERS AND OCCUPIERS

Pursuant to the powers contained in Section 33 of the Bush Fires Act 1954, you are hereby required on or before the first day of November 2018 or within fourteen days of your becoming owner or occupier of land should this be after this day to clear all firebreaks and remove flammable materials from the land owned or occupied by you as specified hereunder and to have the specified land and firebreaks clear of all flammable materials from the first day of November 2018 up to the thirty first day of March 2019.

1. Land Outside Town Sites

- 1.1 All buildings on land which are outside town sites shall be surrounded by two firebreaks not less than two (2) meters wide cleared of all flammable material, the inner firebreak to be not more than twenty (20) meters from the perimeter of the building or group of buildings and the outer firebreak not less than 200 meters from the inner firebreak.
- 1.2 The removal of flammable material from the whole of the land between the firebreaks required in paragraph 1.1 above.

2. Land In Town Sites

- 2.1. Where the area of land is 2000 square meters (approximately ½ acre) or less, all flammable material shall be removed from the whole of the land.
- 2.2. Where the area of land exceeds 2000 square meters, firebreaks at least three (3) meters in width shall be cleared of all flammable material immediately inside and along the boundaries of land. Where there are buildings on the land additional firebreaks three (3) meters in width shall be cleared immediately surrounding each building.

If it is considered for any reason to be impractical to clear firebreaks or remove flammable material as required by this notice, you may apply to the Council not later than the first day of November 2018 for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions or take alternative action to remove or abate fire hazards. If permission is not granted by Council or its' duly Authorized Officer, you shall comply with the requirements of this notice.

"Flammable material" does not include green growing trees or green growing plants in gardens. It also does not include plants native to the region that are fire resistant, for example; saltbush shrubs.

If the requirements of this notice are carried out by burning, such burning shall comply with the relevant provisions of the Bush Fire Act 1954.

The penalty for failing to comply with this notice is a fine of \$5000 and a person in default is also liable, whether prosecuted or not, to pay cost of performing the work directed in this notice, if it is not carried out by the owner or occupier by the date required by this notice.

THE PROHIBITED BURNING PERIOD WILL BE FROM 1 NOVEMBER 2018 TO 31 MARCH 2019 AND SHALL APPLY THROUGHOUT THE WHOLE SHIRE.

Kerbside Waste Collection

REFUSE COLLECTION

Hard refuse should be placed neatly on the verge as close as possible to the kerb and your driveway. The following items will be collected from your verge;

- WHITE GOODS - Stoves, refrigerators (doors to be removed), washing machines etc.
- TRAMPOLINES/SWING SETS must be dismantled
- SCRAP METAL
- OLD FURNITURE
- GENERAL RUBBISH

The white goods and scrap metal should be placed on the verge in a pile separate to the other hard refuse as this will be collected separately and recycled. All items of hard refuse will be collected by hand. A maximum weight will apply and as a general rule, two (2) people should be able to lift the item easily to shoulder height with the item being no longer than 4 metres. Please note this service is available in townsites only. It is important that residents pay close attention to the requirements of the roadside collections. All waste is to be placed in a pile neatly on the verge no earlier than one (1) week prior to the advertised collection week. All waste must be placed on the verge by 6.00am on the advertised starting date as the truck will only travel down your street once. All waste is to be placed on the verge without obstructing footpaths or line of sight particularly adjacent to road intersections. Waste will not be collected from Vacant Properties, Public Land or Land outside townsite boundaries.

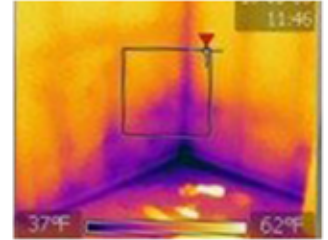

Any pool that is designed for swimming, wading and paddling that contains water more than 30cm deep, must be enclosed by an effective safety barrier that complies with the laws. Please refer to the summarised checklist overleaf.

- ✓ Never prop a pool gate open.
- ✓ Ensure you always actively supervise children within arm's reach whenever they are in, or around the water regardless of how much water is in the pool.
- ✓ Never rely on older children to supervise younger children, no matter how confident you are about their ability.
- ✓ For smaller pools ensure they are emptied and stored safely away from young children after use.
- ✓ Ensure the pool cannot fill with rainwater or water from sprinklers.
- ✓ Ensure the barrier is clear of climbable objects.

Rules for PORTABLE POOLS



Did you know?

By law, swimming and spa pools containing water more than 30cm deep must have effective safety barriers that restrict access by young children.

This includes portable pools.



Does your safety barrier tick all the boxes?

If not, you risk the lives of young children and may face substantial fines or prosecution.

This summarised checklist is not exhaustive and should be read in conjunction with the **Rules for Pools and Spas** brochure.

Check the pool gate

- Does the pool gate close by itself from any open position?
- Does the gate have a self-latching device?
- Does the gate open away from the pool?
- Is the latch release mechanism at least 1.5 metres above the ground?

Check the pool fence

- Is the fence fixed securely in place?
- Is the outside of the fence at least 1.2 metres high?
- Are all vertical uprights in the fence spaced less than 10cm apart?
- Is there at least 90cm between handholds and footholds?
- Is the bottom of the fence 10cm or less from the ground?
- Is the surface directly beneath the fence stable and not easily eroded?
- If a boundary fence forms part of the pool safety barrier, is it at least 1.8 metres high?

Check climbable objects

Barbecues, flower-pots, trees, retaining walls, plumbing, cubby houses, toys, outdoor furniture, pool pumps etc. may all help a young child to climb into the pool area.

- Is the pool area clear of any items that would assist a child to climb over the fence or reach the latch on the gate that provides access to the pool area?

Check windows

Is the openable portion of a window that forms part of a safety barrier:

- permanently restricted to open no more than 10cm by a device that requires the use of a tool to remove it?
- or
- covered by bars or a metal screen, fixed in place by a device that requires the use of a tool to remove it?

Please note that key locks are not considered to be a permanent restriction.

Doors

- Doors with direct access to the pool area require local government approval.
- Pet doors are not permitted.

King Solomon has been described as the wisest and richest man to ever live. He built or oversaw the building of the magnificent temple in Jerusalem, which was his father's dream. He also was known to become totally self indulgent and not deny himself anything that he saw. He took 1000 women as wives or concubines, he drank the finest of wines and had many slaves. A book called Ecclesiastes in the old testament sums up Solomon's conclusions in life as being vanity. Work, play and everything else under the sun is described as vanity or meaningless. The rich, poor, the hard worker, the bludger, the honest, the dishonest all end up in the grave.

In many ways Solomon sums up life without divine purpose and without divine meaning. If we are here by random chance or by some accident , the more we look at life the more we can only conclude the same as what Solomon did.

The new testament speaks of people who put their faith in Christ as God's workmanship. We were created to do good works which God prepared beforehand (Ephesians 2:10). 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Club builds track around mallee fowl nest

The Toyota Landcruise Club of WA reports on recent work on the Holland track.

Project objective: Create new track deviation plus parking area, away from current "Active Mallee Fowl Nest".

Transport stage: Karragullen to Hyden.

8.15am departure: Brookton Highway Karragullen, Tomeo's BP Services Station; great meeting point, as spacious parking area for our nine vehicles. Travel along the Brookton Highway was smooth with not too much traffic going our way. Some dainty yellow and blue wildflowers lined the verge of the forest areas.

The morning skies were clearing with temperature picking up as we headed onto Kondinin to collect bollards that were donated by the Kondinin Shire Council. Our next stop was Hyden to get fuel at the self-service fuel depot (Great Southern Fuels) and then a lunch break at the central Sculptural Park. Hyden was quietly humming with tour buses and fellow travellers.

We left Hyden around 12.50pm, taking the Hyden to Norseman road to link with the Holland track. The Hyden-Norseman Road had a few large trucks thundering along but the drive out was good.

Flame grevilleas, low prostrate wattles and puddles, lined sections of the road, and mine sites were obvious on the horizon. Once on the Holland track our convoy split to allow the heavier vehicle (Chris, carrying the bobcat) to safely manoeuvre.

The condition of the Holland track was mostly ok, with some challenging negotiations for Chris with the trailer and bobcat as there were some deep muddy ruts with tight manoeuvring space! Only a slight hang up in one spot required the snatch strap plus dampener deployed – the support group of Trevor, Don and Dave worked smoothly with Chris, for a quick recovery.



Meanwhile, Kim led the rest of our group toward our camping area. There was a group of travellers along the

track that had two flat tyres, with tyre changes being done on the track and blocking it. They were reasonably quick, and moved off to let us all through.

Our three-night camp site was close to the Mallee Fowl Nest. It was an ideal camping spot, with the bull ants/ jumping ants far enough away not to bother us, plenty of space to throw your tent up plus park trailers/vehicles, mallee trees for shade, and fire pit area clear. Just no swimming pool or spa! But we had a lovely camp fire and good company.

Work day 1: Sunday morning began with a pre-start meeting, where Kim outlined requirements for the work day. Plans were to put a barrier bar around the mallee fowl nest. With a post hole digger plus cement, we all walked through the realignment of the new vehicle/



walking track and parking area (on a previous trip we had taped the changes required). Additional coloured taping to give clear definition to work areas was also used. Safety signs and coloured taping was installed, to alert fellow users of the Holland track that "workers were on track".

Track clearing: Chris, using the bobcat, started the clearing the main diversion track. The track/parking area was substantial in size with brush being pushed along edge of track.

Barrier bar fence around mallee fowl nest: Club members Brick, Reddog, Raven and Bandito did a great job done as the ground subsoil was concrete hard. A posthole digger and grinder were used to make holes big enough.

Walking track: Bob, Brenda, Chamutal, Floretta, Pam and Dave helped to clear the walking track. This was surprisingly achieved in a quick time, with many hands, rakes, mattocks etc put to use. Good job.

Bollards and TLCC sign: Subsoil was once again concrete hard; with the posthole digger and jackhammer used, the signs/bollards were in place after lunch.

Everyone worked to make this a positive work day,

Work day 2: Monday morning pre-start meeting. Tasks were to cover old tracks with brush, install star pickets and Holland track signage regarding the direction of the new tracks. We also collected all tape and road alert signs. Chris used the bobcat to improve the boggy section of the track near camp.

Information about Indue card and Kambalda Christmas Tree



It is that time of the year again and the most popular event in our community is fast approaching. The Kambalda Community Christmas Tree will be held on December 8 this year and registrations are now open.

For online payment via EFT you may use the transfer option on your Indue Web Portal to transfer any amount to a maximum of \$200 per 28 days to an external account using the "EXTERNAL OTHER" selection from the drop down menu. Contact the Kambalda Christmas Tree Committee on KCCT.Rego@gmail.com and ask for further information.

For the purchase of "Day Tickets" and "Ride only Tickets" on the day of the event the preparations to have an EFTPOS facility on site are underway. It is suggested to use your savings for payment.

The local shopfront staff would like to encourage participants to start preparing for the day by saving up cash on their regular bank accounts. If participants have any questions or concerns, it is recommended to seek assistance at your local shopfronts in Coolgardie and Kambalda. Although cash cannot be withdrawn from the Cashless Debit Card, there are options available to help participants in need of cash, for occasions such as the upcoming popular Kambalda Community Christmas Tree.

OPTIONS: The 20 per cent - participants can use the 20 per cent of their Centrelink payment that is deposited into their regular bank account and withdraw this as cash to use on the day of the event; **OR** the \$200/28 days - participants can transfer a maximum of \$200 every 28 days from their Indue account to their regular bank account. Allow for this transfer to take one to two business days to reach your regular bank account, which can then be withdrawn as cash. We recommend doing this transfer by Wednesday, December 5, at the latest to ensure that the cash arrives in your regular bank account by the weekend.

If the above options are not suitable to you or you are seeking assistance on how to do the above, please come and see your friendly local shopfront staff.

Mosquito fogging program begins for season

Please be advised the Coolgardie Shire is currently taking measures to ensure that mosquito breeding does not occur which will help prevent the incidence of mosquito borne diseases such as Ross River Virus and other similar viruses. The Shire is currently working to develop a mosquito management plan which will consider all the available strategies and techniques currently used in the industry, especially the potential for source reduction and larval treatment.

Street fogging is the spraying of an ultra-fine mist into the air from a slowly moving vehicle. The chemicals approved for fogging are usually in the "synthetic pyrethroid" family, which are designed to target insects while having a very low toxicity towards humans and mammals. At the approved dispersion rate the fog is harmless to humans, dogs, cats and birds, but is toxic to fish and aquatic organisms. The use of fogging is weather-dependant with spraying ceasing during windy conditions.

When fogging is in progress, a Shire vehicle will display flashing beacon and vehicle lights and signage notifying of fogging in progress.

In urban environments mosquitoes can breed in a range of water holding containers such as:

- Pot plant drip trays
- Septic and water tanks
- Roof gutters
- Ponds disused containers
- Poorly maintained swimming pools
- Dog water bowls
- Disused car tyres

By removing or maintaining these sites, mosquito numbers can be reduced in urban areas.

Fogging is scheduled to start commencing in November 2018, and residents are invited to make comment to the Shire via email mail@coolgardie.wa.gov.au , or to attend a public forum for residents. Forums will be held at the following locations:

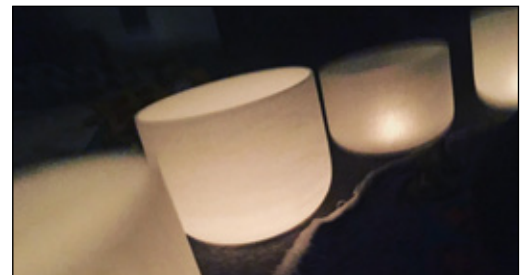


Amana Living information session and lunch
