Message from the Shire President  
December 2018



The end of October through the month of November has been a really busy period for both Council and our staff. Firstly, the auditors from Moore Stephens were here working with the CEO and our finance team to conduct the annual financial audit. This is an important function of the Shire staff, so that compliance and timeframes are met in order to be in a position to complete the annual report prior to December 31 each year.

The Shire was included in a visit to the Goldfields by the Minister for Transport and Planning, Rita Safioti, and her advisers, accompanied by MRWA Regional Manager Shane Power on October 24. The Minister was particularly interested in looking over the proposed site for the Coolgardie Truck Transit Park, as she is also on the lithium strategy working party and as such was interested to learn of the volume of heavy vehicles travelling through the town. Francesca Lefante, our town planner, also briefed the Minister about the Shire land development strategies and we spoke on upgrades to the MRWA section of Bayley Street, which is the centre carriage way through the town.

The Bayley and Ford accommodation village in Coolgardie is progressing well with a large number of the units being transported and installed on site this month. The Northern Star Resources and Rangecon managed project is expected to be fully functional by mid January. It is truly good to see new developments such as this venture being located within the townsite, whereby our local business and economy will receive some benefits.

The Shire of Coolgardie and St John's Ambulance partnership on the initiative to provide an integrated medical service in Kambalda came to fruition on Thursday, November 15. The opening ceremony held at the Kambalda Community Recreation Facility attracted more than 100 interested residents, local service providers, representatives of St John's, WACHS Staff, Councillors and a contingent of Shire staff.

This was a really momentous and exciting occasion to mark the start of what is hoped to be a long standing and sustainable partnership with St John's in the provision medical and volunteer services to the Kambalda community and eventually out into the mining and outer regions of the Shire as well.

Our technical services team received a welcome addition to the vehicle fleet last week with the arrival of the side tipping trailer. This unit completes the road construction and maintenance fleet, which has also benefited by the delivery of a new prime mover and water tanker recently. The addition of these vehicles to our fleet should result in better efficiencies during road construction and maintenance operations in the future.

The Coolgardie community was greatly saddened two weeks ago by the tragic loss of long-time resident and former Shire Councillor, Ronnie Potter. Ronnie had travelled out to his mining lease camp on a day trip and unfortunately went missing for several days out in the bush and tragically passed away before a large number of searchers could locate his whereabouts.

Ronnie had previously served on Council for four years, was a founding member of the Gem and Mineral Club and volunteered at our Shire facilities including the Railway Museum, Warden Finnerty's and Pharmacy Museum along with various other organisations during the 35 years he had lived in Coolgardie. He will be greatly missed by all who knew him, Vale Ronnie Potter.

Coolgardie Shire President Malcom Cullen is pleased to announce that the Shire has successfully negotiated an interim solution for the supply of diesel fuel at a site in Kambalda with local business owner Joe Little at his property at Little Industries in Granby Road, Kambalda in conjunction with Eagle Petroleum.

The temporary arrangements commence on Monday 17 September 2018 and will have effect until 31 March 2019.

Diesel Fuel will be available to the public 24/7 by use of credit card, Eagle Fuel card or Debit card. In addition, emergency limited supply of petrol is available in 20 litre containers on request by contacting Clint Walding directly on 0448 548 853 or by email at [operations@littleindustries.com](mailto:operations@littleindustries.com).



The fuel arrangements are:

- Diesel fuel available 24/7 by use of credit card, Eagle Fuel card or Debit Card
- Vehicles – light and heavy vehicle up to a max of 20 metres (RAV 1 network) are able to refuel at the site.
- Access to the site is via Granby Road. Follow the directional and site signage
- Once at the site there is a dedicated one-way driveway through the site. Please follow the directional signage

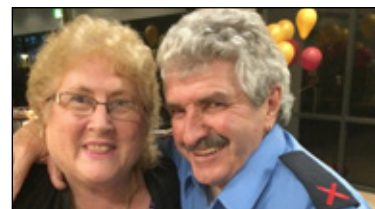
He said it's a very rewarding way to be part of the community and give something back to the town.

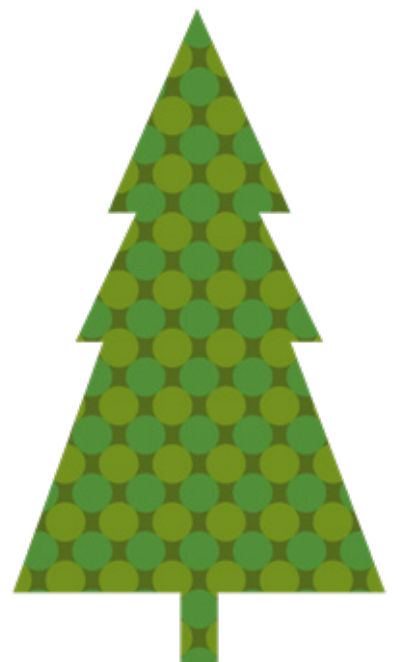
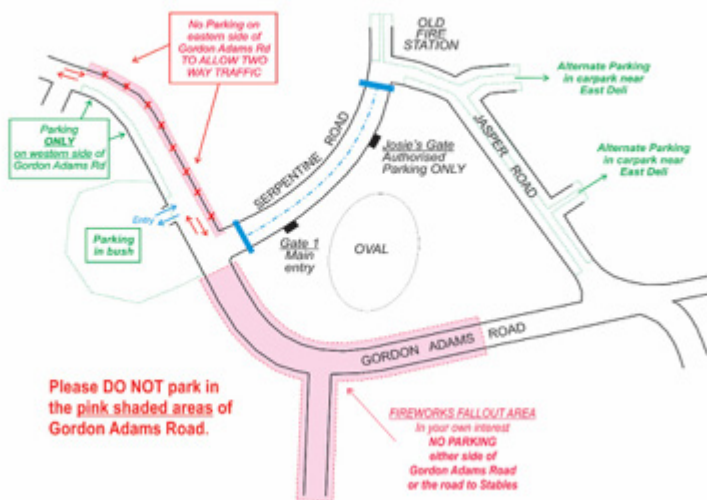

# Be snake aware in the Goldfields

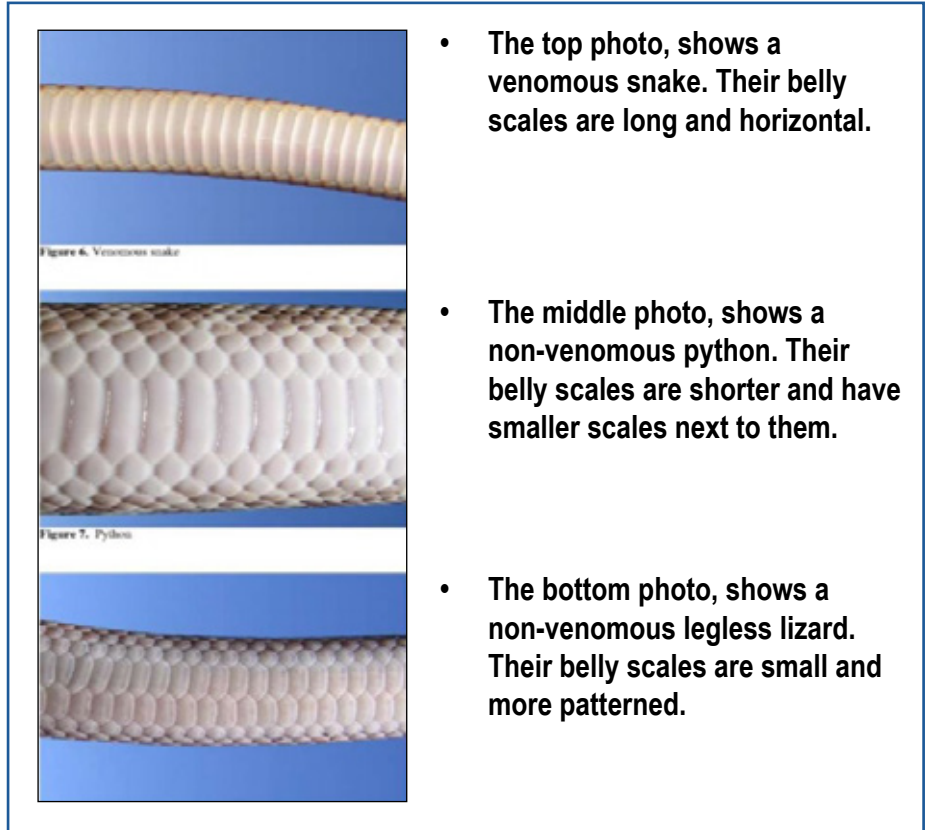
As the weather starts to warm up, the snakes are starting to come out of hiding.

It is important to note that in the Goldfields there are legless lizards (that look very similar to snakes; but are non-venomous), non-venomous snakes (pythons) and venomous snakes. The way to tell the difference between these three species is the scales on their underside.

If you see a snake or suspect a snake to be nearby, DO NOT approach or kill it. Snakes are a protected species in Western Australia and killing them without reason can result in a fine.

There are qualified snake handlers in Coolgardie. Please contact the Shire of Coolgardie on 9080 2111 if you are in need of assistance with a snake. Please do not try and catch the snake yourself, as they can strike and may be venomous.

If you get bitten by a snake, immediately apply pressure to the wound and immobilise it, moving it as little as possible. Call triple zero (000) and try your best to recall what the snake looked like, to help with identification for anti-venom.

- Carpet Python – non-venomous
- Stimson's Python – non-venomous

We then had the 'Ode', followed by one minute silence, followed by 'Reveille' (after we got Kathie back) when the orderlies took the flags back to full height, and then dropped them back to half-mast. Thank you girls!

The RSL president thanked everybody for their attendance and closed the ceremony.

## **BUSH FIRES ACT NOTICE FOR OWNERS AND OCCUPIERS**

Pursuant to the powers contained in Section 33 of the Bush Fires Act 1954, you are hereby required on or before the first day of November 2018 or within fourteen days of your becoming owner or occupier of land should this be after this day to clear all firebreaks and remove flammable materials from the land owned or occupied by you as specified hereunder and to have the specified land and firebreaks clear of all flammable materials from the first day of November 2018 up to the thirty first day of March 2019.

### **1. Land Outside Town Sites**

- 1.1 All buildings on land which are outside town sites shall be surrounded by two firebreaks not less than two (2) meters wide cleared of all flammable material, the inner firebreak to be not more than twenty (20) meters from the perimeter of the building or group of buildings and the outer firebreak not less than 200 meters from the inner firebreak.
- 1.2 The removal of flammable material from the whole of the land between the firebreaks required in paragraph 1.1 above.

### **2. Land In Town Sites**

- 2.1 Where the area of land is 2000 square meters (approximately  $\frac{1}{2}$  acre) or less, all flammable material shall be removed from the whole of the land.
- 2.2 Where the area of land exceeds 2000 square meters, firebreaks at least three (3) meters in width shall be cleared of all flammable material immediately inside and along the boundaries of land. Where there are buildings on the land additional firebreaks three (3) meters in width shall be cleared immediately surrounding each building.

If it is considered for any reason to be impractical to clear firebreaks or remove flammable material as required by this notice, you may apply to the Council not later than the first day of November 2018 for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions or take alternative action to remove or abate fire hazards. If permission is not granted by Council or its' duly Authorized Officer, you shall comply with the requirements of this notice.

"Flammable material" does not include green growing trees or green growing plants in gardens. It also does not include plants native to the region that are fire resistant, for example; saltbush shrubs.

If the requirements of this notice are carried out by burning, such burning shall comply with the relevant provisions of the Bush Fire Act 1954.

The penalty for failing to comply with this notice is a fine of \$5000 and a person in default is also liable, whether prosecuted or not, to pay cost of performing the work directed in this notice, if it is not carried out by the owner or occupier by the date required by this notice.

**THE PROHIBITED BURNING PERIOD WILL BE FROM 1 NOVEMBER 2018 TO 31 MARCH 2019 AND SHALL APPLY THROUGHOUT THE WHOLE SHIRE.**

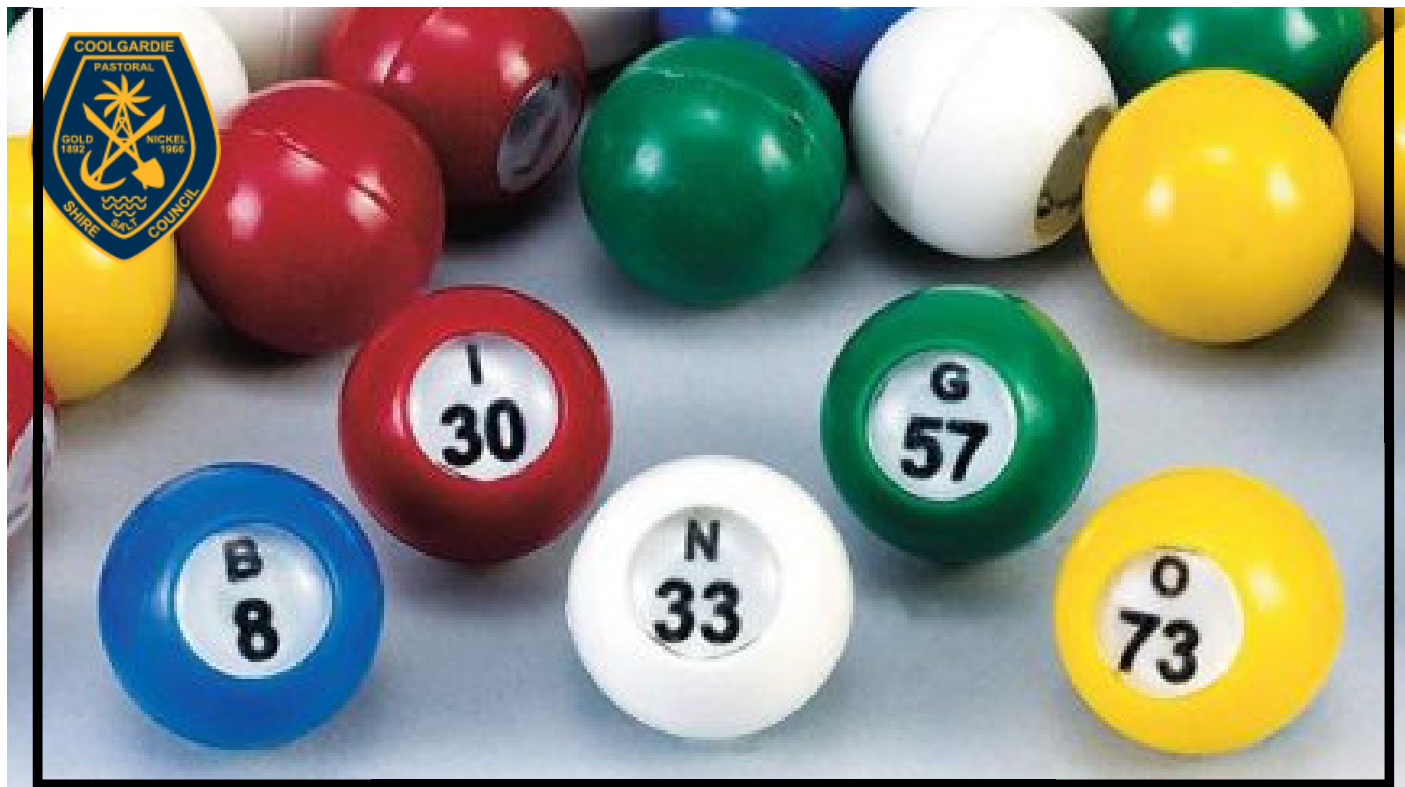

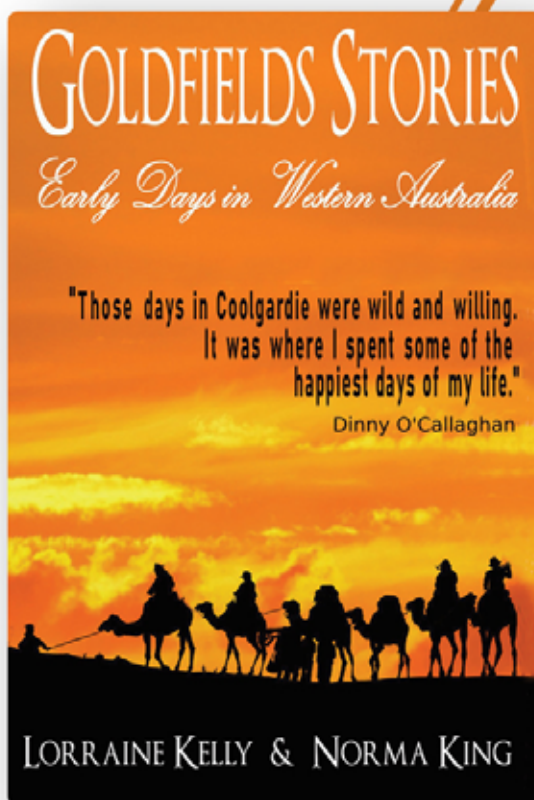

There are many types of portable pools, ranging from small plastic or inflatable paddling pools, specifically designed for young children, to larger more solid inflatable pools or flexible sided pools with frames that can accommodate adults.

Young children can drown in portable pools in a matter of seconds if left unsupervised.

Any pool that is designed for swimming, wading and paddling that contains water more than 30cm deep, must be enclosed by an effective safety barrier that complies with the laws. Please refer to the summarised checklist overleaf.



## Help save young lives in and around water

- ✓ Never prop a pool gate open.
- ✓ Ensure you always actively supervise children within arm's reach whenever they are in, or around the water regardless of how much water is in the pool.
- ✓ Never rely on older children to supervise younger children, no matter how confident you are about their ability.
- ✓ For smaller pools ensure they are emptied and stored safely away from young children after use.
- ✓ Ensure the pool cannot fill with rainwater or water from sprinklers.
- ✓ Ensure the barrier is clear of climbable objects.

# Rules for PORTABLE POOLS



## Did you know?

By law, swimming and spa pools containing water more than 30cm deep must have effective safety barriers that restrict access by young children.

This includes portable pools.



## Does your safety barrier tick all the boxes?

If not, you risk the lives of young children and may face substantial fines or prosecution.

This summarised checklist is not exhaustive and should be read in conjunction with the **Rules for Pools and Spas** brochure.

### Check the pool gate

- Does the pool gate close by itself from any open position?
- Does the gate have a self-latching device?
- Does the gate open away from the pool?
- Is the latch release mechanism at least 1.5 metres above the ground?

### Check the pool fence

- Is the fence fixed securely in place?
- Is the outside of the fence at least 1.2 metres high?
- Are all vertical uprights in the fence spaced less than 10cm apart?
- Is there at least 90cm between handholds and footholds?
- Is the bottom of the fence 10cm or less from the ground?
- Is the surface directly beneath the fence stable and not easily eroded?
- If a boundary fence forms part of the pool safety barrier, is it at least 1.8 metres high?

### Check climbable objects

Barbecues, flower-pots, trees, retaining walls, plumbing, cubby houses, toys, outdoor furniture, pool pumps etc. may all help a young child to climb into the pool area.

- Is the pool area clear of any items that would assist a child to climb over the fence or reach the latch on the gate that provides access to the pool area?

### Check windows

Is the openable portion of a window that forms part of a safety barrier:

- permanently restricted to open no more than 10cm by a device that requires the use of a tool to remove it?
- or
- covered by bars or a metal screen, fixed in place by a device that requires the use of a tool to remove it?

Please note that key locks are not considered to be a permanent restriction.

### Doors

- Doors with direct access to the pool area require local government approval.
- Pet doors are not permitted.

# The Pastor's Pen with Bill Kirkland

The birth of Jesus sparked a barbaric reaction from King Herod, who ordered all male children under the age of two to be put to death simply because he heard that a king had been born. Herod felt threatened, and rage and jealousy overtook him. Joseph (who was Jesus' earthly father) was warned in a dream to leave the country. Mathew 2:13 records 'After the wise men were gone, an angel of the Lord appeared to Joseph in a dream. "Get up! Flee to Egypt with the child and his mother," the angel said. "Stay there until I tell you to return, because Herod is going to search for the child to kill him."

#### **Seniors Have a Go day at Kambalda**

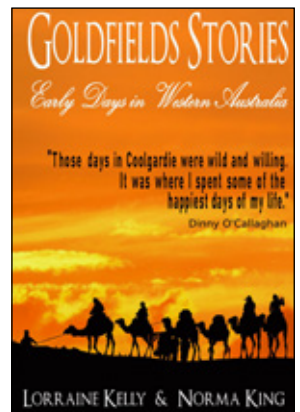
