Message from the Shire President
September 2019



Local Government Week was held in Perth on August 6-9, attracting 1800 representatives from Local Governments throughout WA. Cr Botting, myself, CEO James Trail and our Economic Development team of Mia Hicks and Leanne Shilton, spent a very worthwhile three days engaging and networking with other LG members as well as taking in the views and experiences of the convention presenters. Our staff are excited about bringing some of these ideas and initiatives into our communities for the ongoing benefit of our residents.

Also, while in Perth, we attended the annual Metro Regional Council meeting, where the Shire of Laverton tabled a motion for GVROC to form a working group made up of members of Local Government, Mining Industry, Members of Parliament and other Government agencies to lobby State and Federal Governments to create an economic zone in the Goldfields-Esperance region, with a view to negate some forms of FIFO and encourage residential growth in regional WA.

The St John Health Initiative in Kambalda continues to grow in stature with increased patient patronage at the medical centre and now with the telehealth facility up and running two days per week, adds value for people to attend after hours or on Saturday mornings. Myself and Councillors Rathbone and Lindup experienced a personal experience with Dr Tim Lipscombe demonstrating the operations of the telehealth facility to us last week. Recently, Dr Tim visited Coolgardie where I escorted him on a tour around town to look at the medical centre, post office and various other points of interest, of which he was most appreciative.

Our Staff are working diligently with contractors, consultants and project managers at the moment sorting through various tender documents in an endeavour to recommend preferred tenderers to Council for construction projects about to commence throughout the Shire. Some of these projects include the Post Office Precinct restoration, the Coolgardie Truck Transit parking area and the North Road second stage upgrade. Together with the Kambalda Pool restoration and Ben Prior Park revitalisation, this will bring together a budget spend of around \$11 million, making this one of the most significant milestone years for investment in Shire facilities and infrastructure for many years. It is truly a credit to our CEO and hardworking Staff that they are combining well together as a team to enable these projects to come to fruition.

The Shire hosted the Goldfields Australia Foundation Board at the Kambalda Recreation Centre on August 16 for a special funding announcement. Invited guests, including Member for Kalgoorlie Kyran O'Donnell, Councillors and Staff joined the Board members and several Goldfields St Ives staff to this event where the Board Chair Alex Munt announced the Foundation had donated \$200,000 toward the Kambalda Pool restoration project. This was really welcome news for both the Shire and our community and continues to close the gap on the amount of reserve funds the Shire requires to utilise for the project.

The second Community Conversation workshop was held in Coolgardie on Saturday, September 17, with presentations from Mia Hicks and Francesca Lefante, our town planning consultant. This workshop resulted in a follow up from the initial one conducted some weeks ago, and being reviewed and expanded to include residents suggestions on the proposals to upgrade Bayley St. There were many positive comments from the residents participating in these discussions and from here the updates will be compiled into a detailed concept plan for public comments and Council endorsement in coming months.

Also, on display for viewing were the detailed plans for the Post Office and Truck Parking projects.

Premier Views Plans For Coolgardie Innovation And Economic Development Centre

As part of a Regional Cabinet Roadshow, Premier Mark McGowan and Cabinet Ministers are travelling through the Goldfields to discuss innovation and economic development, regional industries and community health.

The Premier was joined by Shire of Coolgardie elected members, staff and community representatives on a tour of Coolgardie on Sunday, 8 September. The Shire was honoured to also host the Hon Alannah MacTiernan, Minister for Regional Development and Hon Kyle McGinn, Member for Mining and Pastoral Region,

The Premier was formally welcomed by Shire President Malcolm Cullen with a Welcome to Country by local Ricky Dimer and a recital of a Coolgardie poem by Vic Dale.

The Premier also took the time to view the old gaol yard, a number of historical Aboriginal artefacts and the Shire of Coolgardie's "Sharing our Shire" photography exhibition.

The Premier presented a \$15,000 cheque to Coolgardie Day Celebrations representatives for the upcoming Coolgardie Day which is being held on Sunday, 15 September 2019.

The focus of the Premier's visit was the Coolgardie Innovation and Economic Development Centre – a revitalisation of the Shire of Coolgardie Post Office Complex. The plans for the new Innovation Centre include Aboriginal Training Organisation facilities, a Cultural and Community Hub and a micro-business shared office space.

The Coolgardie Innovation and Economic Development Centre is part funded by Shire of Coolgardie, Lotterywest, and the Federal Government's Building Better Regions.

The Shire of Coolgardie aims to build sustainable regional communities through the development of community, industry and economic development infrastructure. The refurbishment and activation of the historic Coolgardie Post Office Complex into the Coolgardie Innovation and Economic Development Centre will help deliver job opportunities and stimulate employment growth in the town.

The Premier's visit concluded with an impressive display of vintage cars along Bayley Street in the Town Centre. The Premier took the opportunity to meet Coolgardie residents and visitors as part of the "Back to the Goldfields" Rally.

Minister Visits Kambalda Pool Project

The Hon Mick Murray MLA, Minister for Seniors and Ageing; Volunteering; Sport and Recreation visited the Kambalda Recreation Precinct over the weekend.

Joined by Shire Councillors, Deputy Shire President Tracey Rathbone, and CEO James Trail, the Minister participated in a tour of the Kambalda Community Recreation Facility and the new Kambalda Aquatic Facility which is currently under construction.

The State Government provided \$700,000 in funding for the new aquatic facility in June 2019. The \$3.4million project includes upgrades to the 50-metre pool, refurbishing the change rooms, relocating the administration office, upgrading the first aid room and developing a new universal access pool.

The Shire of Coolgardie welcomes the support of the State Government in funding sporting and recreation facilities within the community. The Kambalda Aquatic Facility will provide a key sporting tourism asset for the region, as well as providing health and well-being benefits to the local community.

The Streets Of Coolgardie

In Part Two of the series on the history of Coolgardie's streets we cover the years 1894 and 1895, when surveyors added in Moran, Jobson, Lyon, Shaw, Forrest, King and MacDonald streets.

Moran Street: Charles John Moran had a very busy life and career. Born and raised in Toowoomba, Queensland, he moved to WA in 1890 where he initially worked as an apprentice to an architect on the construction of the post office building in Perth. In 1893 he left for the Eastern Goldfields, working briefly for a water supply contractor. He was also one of the survivors of the Siberia rush. At the age of 25, in 1894, he won the election for the seat of Yilgarn and while in parliament was a staunch supporter of the Goldfields water supply scheme. 1897 saw him elected for the first seat of Coolgardie, and he was also director of several mining companies. After his time in parliament he bought a farm in Wagin where he was very prominent in the Farmers and Settlers Association as well as being a trustee of the Rural Relief Board. The government consulted him on rural policy until his death in 1936.

Jobson Street: Christopher Jobson, was an engineer in Broken Hill and in 1893 he came to Coolgardie to take charge of the Goldfields water supply. When he resigned in the late 1890s he was tendered a banquet and presented with an illuminated address carrying 44 signatures. As a further tribute to his work in Coolgardie a cross street was named after him.

Lyon Street: Charles Gordon Lyon, whose sincerity, ability and good judgement assisted in the raising of Coolgardie to the proud position as the center of the Goldfields for a period of time. He partnered with Sylvester Browne and bought Bayley's Reward.

He studied chemistry, mineralogy, assaying and every other subject that led to a thorough knowledge of mining. He was one of the first Justices of Peace in Coolgardie and as a true Australian, always lent his patronage to sport. He was vice president of the Racing Club and held official titles in almost all local teams. Mr. Lyon also had extensive and wealthy interests in Kalgoorlie, Menzies



and Mount Margaret and took a personal interest in every mine he was connected to. He truly was a leading citizen of Coolgardie.

Shaw Street: The very first elected mayor of Coolgardie, James Shaw, arrived in 1893 and remained in office for 17 months before retiring. Though it was government officials who actually and directly did the surveying of the streets, as the mayor he put great pressure on them to make them conform to his ideas. He was also the first president of the cricket and football clubs. Sadly, his son Hugh Hamilton died at the age of 18 from typhoid fever. He is buried in the Coolgardie Cemetery.

Forrest Street: The Honorable Sir John Forrest was a surveyor, explorer and most notably, a politician. He was the first professional politician in Western Australia, and the most successful and influential public man in his home State during the whole of his career. As a surveyor and civil servant, he was never denied a promotion, and as a State and Federal politician he never lost his seat at an election. His government's most significant contributions to Western Australia's development was the construction of the Coolgardie Water Scheme, Fremantle harbour, and the East-West Transcontinental Railway. He was present for the official opening of the Coolgardie Railway Station and also attended a banquet for Mayor Shaw upon his retirement.

King Street: Mr Henry Sanford King was a supervising surveyor and later surveyor-general and so was honoured with the naming of King Street. Lake King - a small town in the Eastern Wheatbelt between Wagin and Ravensthorpe - was named after a nearby lake and in turn named after H.S King.

MacDonald Street: When Mayor Shaw retired from office, it was Albert Watt MacDonald who was chosen to fill the chair, which made him Coolgardie's second mayor. He was very passionate about the development of the town. He arrived in Coolgardie in August of 1893, which were the town's early days, and decided to go out prospecting. After six months he returned to find the town had rapidly expanded and so proceeded to open an auctioneering business.

He was president of the Health Board, a member of the Stock Exchange, and one of its original promoters. When the Coolgardie railway opened, he was appointed chairman of the reception committees to do honor to the many influential visitors who arrived to witness the inauguration of a new era for the Goldfields of Coolgardie.

Gnarlbine Road: Cleary named after the Gnarlbine Soak, which was discovered in 1863 by H.M Lefroy and improved by C.C Hunt the following year. The water was of great assistance to later explorers and prospectors such as Alexander Forrest in 1871 (who was the younger brother of Sir. John Forrest), Gillie McPherson – a prominent prospector in this area and also the Kimberley, and of course Arthur Bayley and William Ford.

Wilkie Street: John and Adam Wilkie were the contractors for the construction of the railway line from Southern Cross to Kalgoorlie, which was completed in 1896. By arrangement with the government, they operated the train service until it was taken over by the railways department on January 1, 1897. They also built the Railway Hotel located across the road from the Kalgoorlie station, which acted as the prime spot for passengers disembarking from the trains.

Lady Loch Road: Lastly, we have Lady Loch Road. Not much is known about the name of this road except that it was named after the Lady Loch mine.

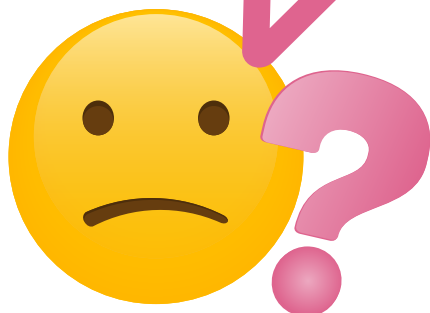

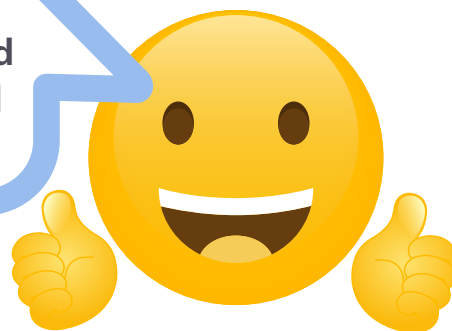

Writer Shares Insights Into Railway Hotels

On Monday and Tuesday, the 12th and 13th of August, 2019, Coolgardie had a very special visit from Scott Whitaker (SRW Publishing), an Australian author.

Scott Whitaker grew up in Melbourne in the 1960s before being transferred to Queensland with his employer Air Services (then Department of Aviation). After working in air traffic control for more than 30 years, he retired a few years ago. Scott returned to Melbourne but has recently returned to Queensland to soak up the sunshine at Bowen (in the northern region of the Whitsundays). He has two adult children.

His interests include railways, Australian history and travel. It is these interests that Scott collectively seized upon at retirement as he entered the world of authorship, travelling around Australia to explore the history of the Railway Hotels of Australia.

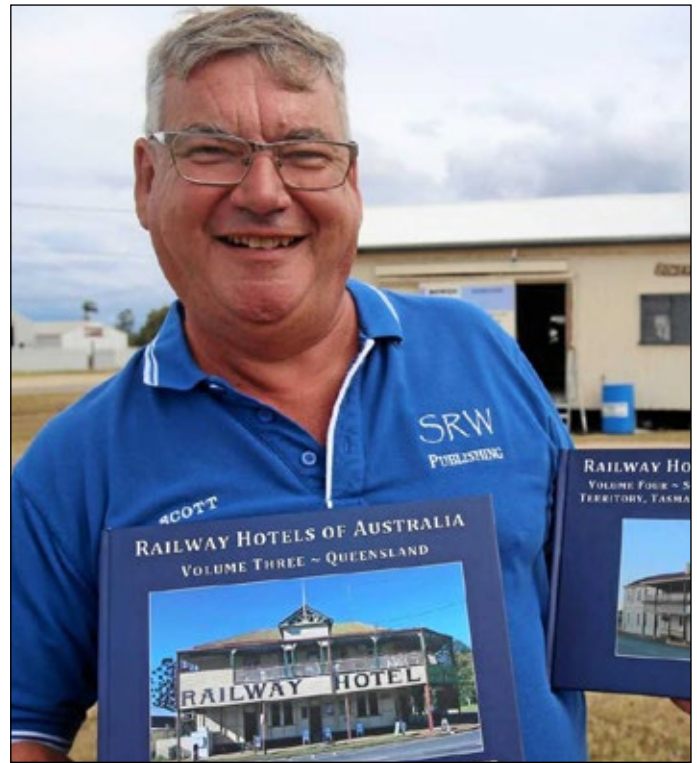
Scott gave an informative, exciting and interesting talk about his travels, railways and about his books on the railway hotels of Australia. He even mentions Coolgardie in his books!

Scott explained how in the early days, railway hotels (along with terminus, junction and station) were quickly established to service the railway construction workers, or navvies. Some publicans stayed in the new town, others moved on with the navvies to the next camp. Some existing hotels were renamed to celebrate the arrival of railway communication, and some were moved to a new site nearer the railway station.

Inevitably, the railway hotel was the haunt of the local railway workforce. There was once more than 600 railway hotels in Australia, but by the 1920s many had gone. Some had been burnt down - deliberately or otherwise - or even levelled by an earthquake or washed away in a flood. Nevertheless there could have been more.

Would-be publicans at Mt Gambier in South Australia, Cook on the Nullarbor Plain and at Alice Springs in the Northern Territory as well as at many other places, announced their intention of opening a railway hotel. Some of these people were refused a licence, some had a change of heart or some simply opened their hotel under a different name.

We thank Scott for taking the time to come out to Coolgardie and hope to have him back in the future!

- Maximum of \$150 per child per calendar year.
- \$150 can be split over multiple clubs.
- Fees are only for the nominated registered season.
- No retrospective fees will be paid.
- No limitation to the number of applications per family, providing the criteria for each child is met.
- Applicants can only receive KidSport funding for a financial exception once.



KidSport financial exceptions

If applicants are not listed on a valid concession card they can apply for a KidSport financial exception through a financial assessor.

Who are KidSport financial assessors?

KidSport financial assessors are professional employees at agencies who provide support services for families. They will assess a family's financial situation against the KidSport financial exceptions and submit a KidSport application on their behalf. The department will review and assess the application.

Financial exceptions

- 1 Sudden loss of employment and subsequent income from the main income earner of the family. This does not include voluntary unemployment or circumstances where a redundancy payment has been received.
- 2 Death or serious illness of a parent/guardian causing significant impact on the household income.
- 3 Fire, flood or other natural disaster causing significant impact on the household's financial situation.
- 4 Situations where the child has been placed into care (of the State, foster or extended family) and the relevant concession cards are unavailable.

Welcome to KidSport!

Sport helps you step up and gives you confidence to become part of a team, make friends and kick goals. Sport is great practice for life on and off the playing field. It builds stronger, healthier, happier and safer communities and should be part of every child's life regardless of their circumstances, ability or where they come from.

Active children are more likely to be active adults. Sport is fun, but just as importantly, participation gives your child a better chance of doing well at school, improves coordination and balance, helps them sleep better, improves social and life skills and creates a greater sense of wellbeing. When kids play sport, the whole community wins.

What is **KS** KIDSPORT?

KidSport enables eligible children in Western Australia, aged 5-18 years old, to participate in community sport by offering them financial assistance towards club fees.

Eligibility criteria

- Applicants must be aged 5-18 years.
- Applicants must be listed on a valid Health Care or Pensioner Concession card issued by Centrelink.
- Applicants must reside in Western Australia.

How do I get involved?

Applicants listed on a valid Health Care or Pensioner Concession Card can apply online, on the KidSport website www.dsr.wa.gov.au/kidsport.

- Applications are assessed within 10 working days and if approved your code will be emailed to you.
- Voucher codes should be submitted to the club. Clubs can then claim their funding through their online portal.
- Vouchers expire after 90 days.

Applicants who are not listed on a valid concession card but meet one of the KidSport financial exceptions can apply for KidSport by contacting a financial assessor.

Shire Rangers are currently focusing on littering and Illegal dumping in and around the Shire's towns. Not only does it make our towns look untidy, but it is also bad for our environment and the wildlife in the area. Ranger's would like to remind the community that any form of littering is an offence and if caught may incur an infringement:

To avoid being penalised, the Shire Rangers strongly encourage residents to utilise waste disposal sites for all large amounts of waste that need to be disposed of and for all waste that is unsuitable for the Shire-supplied household green bins.

Tip passes are issued yearly with the rates but should you require more, they can be purchased from the Shire for \$50. EFTPOS is also available at the tip to pay as you go.

Be Snake Aware In The Goldfields

As the weather starts to warm up, the snakes are starting to come out of hiding.

It is important to note that in the Goldfields there are legless lizards (that look very similar to snakes; but are non-venomous), non-venomous snakes (pythons) and venomous snakes. The way to tell the difference between these three species is the scales on their underside.

If you see a snake or suspect a snake to be nearby, DO NOT approach or kill it. Snakes are a protected species in Western Australia and killing them without reason can result in a fine.

There are qualified snake handlers in Coolgardie. Please contact the Shire of Coolgardie on 9080 2111 if you are in need of assistance with a snake. Please do not try and catch the snake yourself, as they can strike and may be venomous.

If you get bitten by a snake, immediately apply pressure to the wound and immobilise it, moving it as little as possible. Call triple zero (000) and try your best to recall what the snake looked like, to help with identification for anti-venom.

Bush Fire Act Notice

For Owners And Occupiers

Pursuant to the powers contained in Section 33 of the Bush Fires Act 1954, you are hereby required on or before the first day of November or within fourteen days of your becoming owner or occupier of land should this be after this day to clear all firebreaks and remove flammable materials from the land owned or occupied by you as specified hereunder and to have the specified land and firebreaks clear of all flammable materials from the first day of November up to the thirty first day of March.

1. Land Outside Town Sites

- 1.1 All buildings on land which are outside town sites shall be surrounded by two firebreaks not less than two (2) meters wide cleared of all flammable material, the inner firebreak to be not more than twenty (20) meters from the perimeter of the building or group of buildings and the outer firebreak not less than 200 meters from the inner firebreak.
- 1.2 The removal of flammable material from the whole of the land between the firebreaks required in paragraph 1.1 above.

2. Land In Town Sites

- 2.1 Where the area of land is 2000 square meters (approximately ½ acre) or less, all flammable material shall be removed from the whole of the land.
- 2.2 Where the area of land exceeds 2000 square meters, firebreaks at least three (3) meters in width shall be cleared of all flammable material immediately inside and along the boundaries of land. Where there are buildings on the land additional firebreaks three (3) meters in width shall be cleared immediately surrounding each building.

If it is considered for any reason to be impractical to clear firebreaks or remove flammable material as required by this notice, you may apply to the Council not later than the first day of November for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions or take alternative action to remove or abate fire hazards. If permission is not granted by Council or its' duly authorised Officer, you shall comply with the requirements of this notice.

"Flammable material" does not include green growing trees or green growing plants in gardens. It also does not include plants native to the region that are fire resistant, for example; saltbush shrubs.

If the requirements of this notice are carried out by burning, such burning shall comply with the relevant provisions of the Bush Fire Act 1954.

The penalty for failing to comply with this notice is a fine of \$5000 and a person in default is also liable, whether prosecuted or not, to pay cost of performing the work directed in this notice, if it is not carried out by the owner or occupier by the date required by this notice.

**THE PROHIBITED BURNING PERIOD WILL BE FROM 1 NOVEMBER TO 31 MARCH
AND SHALL APPLY THROUGHOUT THE WHOLE SHIRE.
THE RESTRICTED BURING PERIOD WILL BE FROM 1OCTOBER THROUGH TO 30 APRIL.**

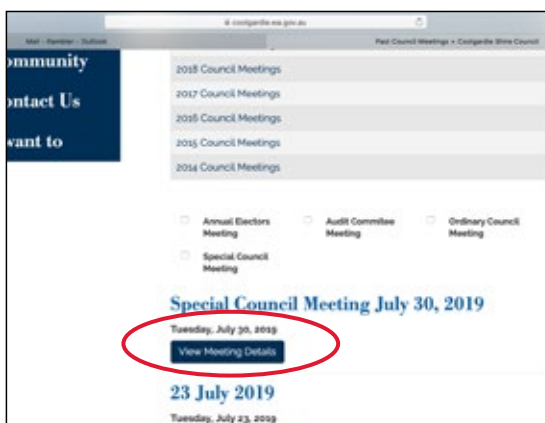
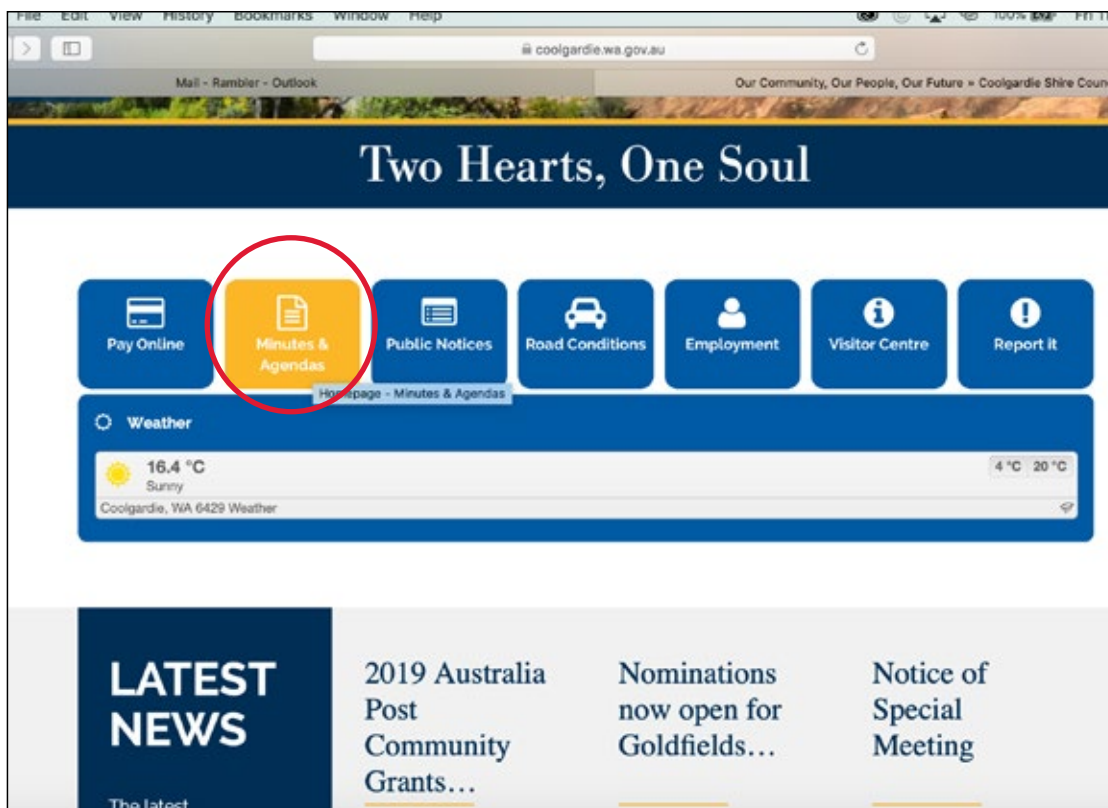

Mural Project by John Scott

Ashlee takes up a big challenge

Emerging local Artist Ashlee Donkin is painting a mural that will take pride of place in the front window of the Kambalda Arts Centre. This project is part of a series of activities within the 'Connect to the Creative Grid', being coordinated by Southern Forest Arts (SFA), through the Regional Arts Partnership Program (RAPP) delivered by Country Arts WA under the State Government's Scheme Four Initiative, the \$24 million Royalties for Regions investment into arts and culture across WA.

This project is a mentorship for emerging artist Ashlee Donkin under the guidance of Kambalda artist John Scott, coordinated by us (KCCAG), under direction of the Creative Grid Creative Grid coordinator Fiona Sinclair at SFA.

The Creative Grid is a collective of 40 plus regional arts organisations working together collaboratively in developing a series of 50 mentorships for artists, curators and photographers.

We were allocated this mentorship under Emerging Public Artist Mentorship packages. There are many benefits emerging from this program with amazing results across the state and this is a credit to Country Arts WA, Government and ourselves to be included representing Kambalda.

Locally, this fits well into our own public art project "Kambalda Art Roadhouse Murals" (KARM), developing at the Kambalda Arts Centre. The mural is progressing slowly from the design by Ashlee based on the premise's heritage and environment, formally operating as the BP Kambalda West Service Station between 1969 and 1992, the great outback and utilising her quirky art style involving Australian wildlife.

The transition from painting on small canvasses in her preferred medium of oils, to larger scale has presented some difficulties with using household acrylic paint on composite panels as the substrate. The process of mixing paint in larger quantities is new, but Ash has adapted.

Painting murals requires physical exertion and due to Ash's chronic health issues, this has made it difficult for her. While possessing enormous talent, a smart mind, lots of ability, that does not overcome the challenges presented by larger scale works, so only occasional short painting sessions are advisable. That slows the process, tends to frustrate, but has not lessened the quality of the art and is a lesson on its own.

Her impairment is not considered rare, but its severity varies. It is called EHLERS Danlos Syndrome or EDS, entailing joint dislocation, muscle and skin disorder and many other symptoms such a congenital heart disease, swelling of the legs, chronic pain. Some who have this health issue go undetected, but Ash's case, it has been after misdiagnosis for many years. I have seen how it affects her sometimes and she needs medication and rest.

Due to this difficulty, Ashlee is most unlikely to be taking up mural painting as part of her career.

This narrows down her scope as a professional Artist, but her determination and ability to solve problems still leaves her with a bright future in the arts field. Her life is based around art and soon her studies will be complete with a Diploma in Graphic Design. Keep adding all her other skills, embroidery & design, digital print & design, building computers, painting in many mediums, drawing, illustrations, writing and many other interests focussed around creativity. Ashlee is finding her "knish" and I am excited about maybe witnessing her progress. On a personal note, I am enjoying this project as it has brought together two artist that would not have had this opportunity to assist the overall aim to build on our exhibition at the Kambalda Arts Centre.

The way the overall project was planned, entailing enormous amounts of work, planning and delivering on a wide scale, Southern Forest Arts through their project coordinator Fiona Sinclair, working in collaboration with Artists on a broad scale, is a credit to Western Australia.

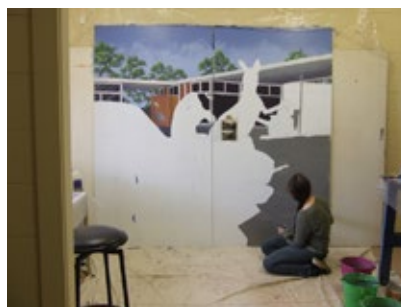

FIRST RESPONDER APP

St John Ambulance WA has released a new, free smart phone app, First Responder.

The St John First Responder app has a range of features, one being its unique first responder capability. The app allows qualified first aiders to sign up as a first responder and be notified when someone has called 000 for an ambulance within 500 metres of their current location and in a public place.

To become a first responder you will need to provide evidence of having completed a first aid course within the last three years. Minimum qualification level of HLTAID001 Provide cardiopulmonary resuscitation.

If you're not looking to sign up as a first responder yet, then that's okay! The app also contains a number of other resources, including:

First aid instruction guides – helping you to treat a range of injuries and illnesses.

Triple zero (000) calling with automatic GPS location – calling 000 from the app will send your GPS coordinates direct to the St John State Operation Centre, making it easier for an ambulance to locate you.

Defibrillator (AED) locator - showing all the defibrillator locations near you.

Upload the location of new defibrillator (AED) locations that aren't currently appearing on the app.

Locate nearest medical centres and emergency departments - including live ED waiting time information.

Patient transport services information.

Your first aid course information and refresher reminder notices

First aid tips and special offers - keeping you up to date with handy first aid information.
